The tentative dates of the event will be around the GNOME 3.0 release in April 2011. Hong Kong is well known being one of the largest cities in southeast Asia, with a thriving cultural scene, solid infrastructure, robust public transportation system and top notch eats. DotAsia Organisation is a not-for-profit organization incorporated in Hong Kong. It is the Sponsoring Organisation and Registry Operator for the .Asia Sponsored Generic Top Level Domain (TLD). DotAsia oversees the policies and governance of the ".Asia" TLD Registry.

The DotAsia Organisation is established with a mandate to contribute its proceeds into socio-technological advancement initiatives for the Internet community in Asia. Leveraging the network and expertise at DotAsia, community contributions will be directed towards the following 3 main areas:

- Digital inclusion related projects, especially in the bridging the digital divide and helping the digital "have-nots" gain better access to information technology
- Initiatives advancing education in Asia as well as scholarships and other open knowledge contributions (such as open license educational materials), especially leveraging the Internet
- Research and development efforts that are charitable nature and beneficial to the community, including projects such as socio-technical research, open source development, disaster relief and rebuild efforts especially on information infrastructure support, etc.



OAKA



Opensource Application Knowledge Association, **OAKA** is a not for profit opensource organisation based in Hong Kong. OAKA is established and registered under HK Societies Ordinance in 2004 by a group of Free and Opensource advocates with different professions. OAKA is aimed to study how to apply opensource software and concepts in practice, and promote Free and Opensource applications to general public. **OAKA** is the most active grass-root opensource event organiser in Hong Kong.



Chinese **FreeFonts** project is a Chinese font making project to create 4,700+ Chinese characters commonly used in Hong Kong, released in open source license. Fonts are merged with existing opensource traditional & simplified Chinese fonts. 12 Chinese FreeFont Making Workshops are organised by OAKA for this project.



Teamed up with the Hong Kong Federation of Education Workers, OAKA pioneered the **OSFarm** and **OSLeader** Project in 2005-07 funded by the Quality Education Fund from the government.

- Created a localised Linux CD for Schools and Distributed about 1000 Physical Copies.
- Reached out to more than 30 schools, Trained more than 90 Students as OSLeader and each of them helped 3 other students to adopt FOSS.



OAKA organised Firefox Parties in 2004, 2008 and 2011 for version 1.0, 3.0 and 4.0, targeted hundreds of local Firefox users.



Software Freedom Day in 2009 and 2010, organised by OAKA, have more than 150 audiences.



OAKA organises Ad-hoc gatherings for different F/OSS-related topics in different scales. Examples: Mobile The Gathering, Maemo Development and MeeGo, Ubuntu 10.10 Release Party, Netbook The Gathering, EeePC The Gathering, Linux The Gathering.



And we celebrated GNOME 2.6 Release in Hong Kong too.




Photo 3: Activity Room for 30 people provided by Breakthrough




Photo 4: Activity Room for 15 people provided by Breakthrough




Photo 5: Activity room for 70 people provided by Breakthrough
