1 Summary

In July 2009 the GNOME Foundation undertook a web survey of GNOME Foundation members. Approximately 240 people responded to the survey. The questionnaire is shown in Section 5 on page 6.

This report shows simple frequency tabulations of the numeric responses. The free-text responses have not been analysed, as it is much better for the people who commissioned the research to read them, as opposed to any type of quantitative analysis.

2 Main Results

Table 1 shows a summary of the affirmative responses to the yes/no questions.

3 What Should the Foundation Focus On?

It is difficult to analyse ranking questions. A higher rank implies that the respondent wants the GNOME Foundation to focus more on the indicated activity. However looking at the “average” (in the table, the average is simply the arithmetic mean of the ranks 1 – 9) alone is misleading. Consider, for example the rankings given to the first option “Exactly what it’s doing now”. The mean rank of 4.6 implies that most respondents favour that option. But looking at the bar chart we can see that the distribution is b-modal: many people place that option as the lowest priority.

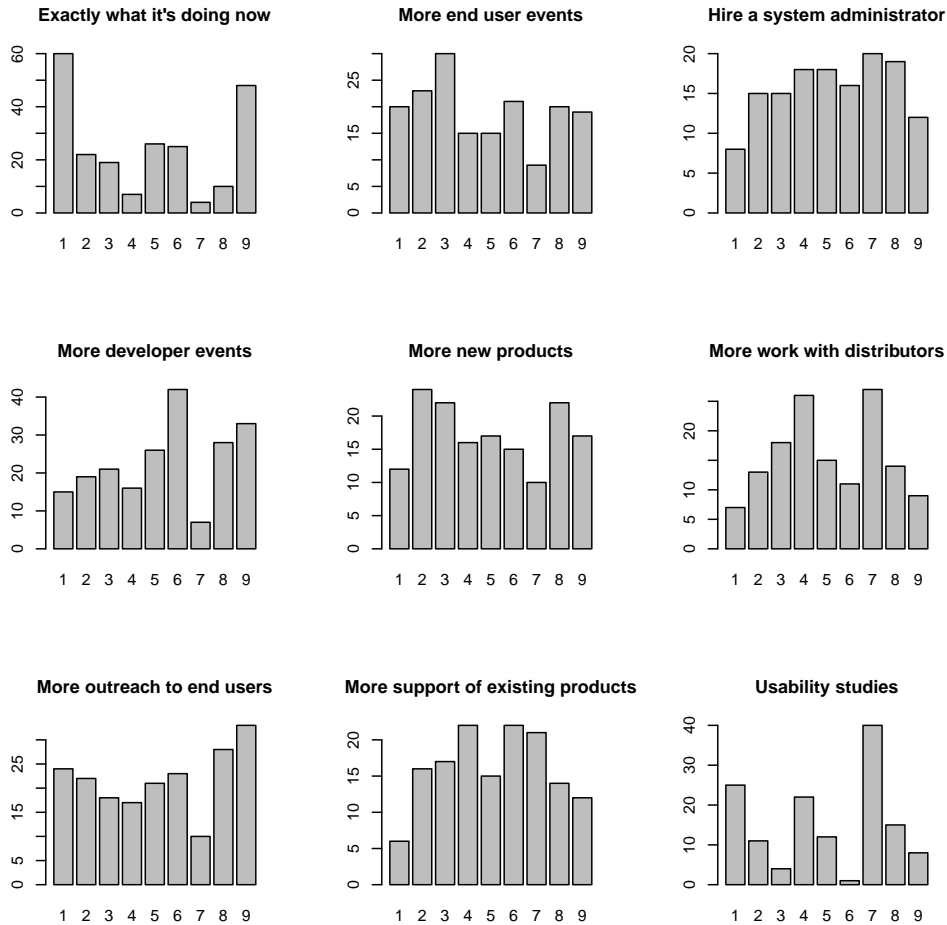


Figure 1: Rankings

Hence, the best way to “analyse” the ranks is simply to look at the distributions. I’ve included a table of means in case that might be helpful in addition to eyeballing the charts.
